# Academic Affairs

## Proficiency Testing

Sometimes students have completed high school course work during their seventh or eighth grade years and wish to be placed in higher level courses upon entering high school. Usually these students are looking for placement in math courses and/or world language courses. Here at Cathedral, we want to work with any incoming freshman student who feels he/she has completed high school work as a middle school student.

Students wishing to gain higher placement in world languages must take a proficiency test for the courses in which they desire to test out. Students wishing to move on to Spanish II, French II, Latin II, or German II must take the first-year proficiency test.

Students wishing to be placed into geometry as freshmen must have passed the Core 40 Algebra I exam. A copy of the official documentation of a passing score must be provided to us by the middle school or by the parent. This documentation should be sent to the attention of Mrs. Lisa Ford, Vice Principal for Academic Affairs. Students who have not taken or not passed the Core 40 Algebra I exam will take Algebra I with us during their freshman year. As passing the Core 40 Algebra I exam is a graduation requirement for the Class of '14, there are no exceptions to this requirement. Incoming freshmen who wish to be placed into Algebra II must pass our geometry proficiency test. The minimum passing score is 85%.

We have two dates scheduled for these proficiency tests:

Sat., June 5—9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

Wed., June 9—3:45 p.m. to 5:15 p.m.

The registration form for these tests is in this edition of the Insight. Students must be pre-registered for these exams, so that we will be adequately prepared with proctors and exams. There is a \$10 fee for each exam.

Arrangements will be made on an individual basis for those students who are qualified to take the second-year language proficiency tests.

## AP Testing

Students who are taking or have taken an Advanced Placement course this school year will be taking their AP tests in May. All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the exam—this is considered one of the expectations of taking the course. All families will be appropriately billed for these tests. AP testing takes place during the first two weeks of May, and the schedule is:

## CORE 40 End-of-Course Assessments

Core 40 exams will be administered in Algebra 1, English 10, and Biology during the week of May 17-May 21. The Algebra 1 and English 10 exams are two-day exams. Passing the Algebra 1 and English 10 exams is a requirement for graduation. Parents are asked to emphasize to their students the importance of these exams. The school will be on a special schedule that week to allow for the testing. The daily schedule for the testing days (May 17-20) will be:

8 to 8:10 a.m. (prayer, pledge, attendance)

8:10 to 9:40 a.m.(class)

9:50 to 11:20 a.m. (class)

11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. (class and lunch)

1:40 to 3:10 p.m. (class)

On May 17, the classes will be periods 1,2,3,4 (in that order). On May 18, the classes will be periods 5,6,7,8. On May 19, the classes will be periods 4,3,2,1. On May 20, the classes will be periods 8,7,6,5.

## Campus Minister

As we return from Spring Break, Holy Week and Easter, our thoughts quickly turn towards spring then summer. Easter gives us that chance to bask in the Easter Season all through spring till Pentecost arrives. It is about the budding of trees and appearance of daffodils and tulips and oh so soon the dreaded dandelions.

But spring also promotes hope. It tells us that the dreaded winter is finally over and soon the days will be getting longer. Maybe I will even be driving to school in daylight soon. I still can't figure out daylight savings.

This hope is a major part of the message Jesus gives us at Easter. Hope in the resurrection. Hope in eternal life. Hope that we will see Jesus return. We can live in hope all our lives. We hope for better things. We hope for better jobs or even a job, in some cases. We hope for our children that they may have an easier time at life than we did, and we had it pretty good. So hope springs eternal as the saying goes.

As Christians we are called to be hopeful people. Jesus came that we may have life. This is the most hopeful we can ever want – eternal life. Without hope we are doomed to a dreaded existence. It is terrible to see people who have lost hope, who have given up on hope, and who are hopeless. We feel less empowered around them and sometimes we feel we cannot even lift them out of this hopelessness.

But we do not give up hope. We strive to make things better. We attempt many do over's in our lives. We know that tomorrow will bring a new day with new opportunities.

Our language as parents instills hope in our children. We need to be positive in almost all circumstances without being Pollyannaish. We are the examples. It is terrible for a child so young in life to lose hope. They have so much to look forward to; their whole life is ahead of them. Yet I am confronted often with the language from students that they feel hopeless. Many times it is just comforting words that they need. And often they may not say it but they just need a hug or to know that someone loves them.

That is our role as a parent—to let our children know they are loved no matter what. We may not like what they are doing or who they are hanging with, but we have to always, always let them know they have a family who loves them. We are to be that island of hope for them. We are the center.

If we don't know where to go as parents, let me suggest you lean on God more. Ask God to show you and ask him to instill more hope in your day so that it flows from your center. A simple prayer like, "God, please give me more than enough hope for me and my family so I can share your love and hope every day." Sometimes we just have to be a little selfish with our prayers. That is hopeful, too.

## Service Outreach

“You Shall Be Like a Watered Garden”

“This, rather, is the manner of fasting I wish, releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; setting free the oppressed; breaking every yoke; sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and the homeless, clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own.” Isaiah 58:6

Servant leadership was powerfully attested by three Cathedral alumni in our Students in Action and Initiative Leadership workshop (SAIL) on March 13. Provocatively challenged by their predecessors, our Cathedral students attentively listened to their convicting messages of Irish advocacy. Eric Howard, founder of Outreach Inc., class of 1991, encouraged Cathedral students to actively descend our Cathedral hill to champion the needs of the homeless teenagers coexisting invisibly in our twenty-four area high schools in Indianapolis. He said he did not need one more pair of outdated jeans or one more pair of socks. Instead, his agency needs the commitment of teenagers willing to join in sustained relationship and support of their homeless peers. Eric read the scripture from Isaiah 58:6 exhorting us to not turn our backs.

Class of 2001 graduate Eric Saunders instructed Cathedral students to focus upon the essence of knowing their city and its problems. Who can ignore the nakedness and needs of children in our midst, he questioned? A Match Specialist at Big Brothers Big Sisters, Eric urged Cathedral students to remove the blinders and understand that many classmates do not have the word condo in their daily lifestyle, let alone a household in Indianapolis. He challenged students to humble themselves to truly understand the needs of others and to persevere in their own self definition. He wondered if we could put aside the petty concerns

of our privileged day to day lives and to shape ourselves by fire. Persuasively, he asked each student to know their bible and to solidify their relationship with Christ. He advocated that we have a responsibility to know the underbelly of the city and to be determined to work in justice for those in need. Each student graduates from Cathedral with this charge.

Pat Jerrell, president of St. Vincent De Paul, class of '66, reviewed the essential characteristics of servant leadership of listening, empathy, persuasion, foresight and conceptualization. He emphasized consensus decision making and igniting the creativity of youth. He advocated youth to use their enthusiasm and dreams to be visionary. A leader of a tremendous all-volunteer organization, St. Vincent De Paul, Pat reviewed with us the key concepts of group renewal and affirmation. Saying thanks is a very vital way of re-enforcing the good will of one's group.

It was absolutely invigorating to have these three Cathedral alumni share how the worth and work of their agencies and their servant leadership each day is dynamically grounded for them in our faith. Our students were inspired and motivated by the stewardship and vision of these servant leaders. We closed with a fun session of zumba dance instruction. Servant leadership and fun go hand in hand. We are now sufficiently vested to be like a watered garden, in vibrant concert with our God.

All band students and parents new to our program are invited to attend one of our two band informational

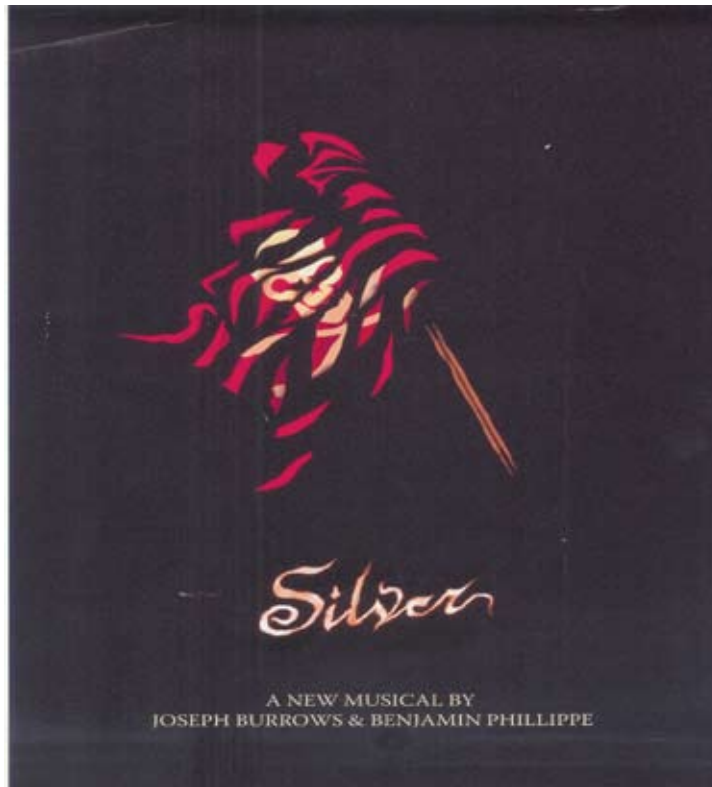
