Dear Cathedral Family,

As I am writing this letter to you, Cathedral is actively preparing to have the 2010-11 school year begin well. Summer school has been successfully completed with 391 students completing 467 courses, Camp Cathedral is progressing well, sports camps are in progress, and physical changes for the school are near completion. Class schedules have been mailed to our students, and teachers are coming in to be ready for their classes. This year we are pleased that we have full classes with a wonderful balance of students' skills, traits, unique personalities, and giftedness.

One of my most important tasks each summer is to see that faculty and staff ranks are filled with well-qualified educators. This year, we have added nine teachers and two guidance counselors. One schedule change that you will see this year will be that our first day of school, Thurs., Aug. 12, will be a half-day of school because of in-service that is being done with our faculty and staff during this week. Students will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m. on that day. Friday, Aug. 13 will be a full-day of classes and will include our Opening All-School Mass from 9:30 to 11 a.m. in the Robert V. Welch Student Activity Center. Parents are always invited to our Liturgies, if you are able to attend.

One reminder that I would like to give to new Cathedral parents who will be picking students up on that first half-day is that we have a large campus, so it will take your student extra time to make it to your car. Generally, by the time they have gone to their lockers, stopped at the rest room, and greeted friends, it makes most sense if you arrive closer to 11:50 a.m. to pick them up. That way, you are less likely to be in that very long line of parents waiting for students.

For the past three years, the administration at Cathedral has worked to strengthen our connections to our founding order, the Brothers of Holy Cross. This began with a trip to the Holy Cross Institute in 2008 and going again this past spring. In addition, Jim McLinn and I visited three Holy Cross schools in Ohio in 2008. More recently, Steve Helmich has been in communication with the Brothers as we work toward reaffiliating with them. After the work done these past three years, I am feeling a definite connection to these Brothers, who are so much a part of our Cathedral history.

Once again, I thank you for choosing Cathedral High School to partner with you in raising your child(ren). By choosing Cathedral, you have put great faith in us. We will work to see that your faith in us is fulfilled!

# Academic Affairs

Welcome to the 2010-11 school year! We are thrilled to have the students and teachers back in school doing what they do best: learning and teaching! ## PowerSchool

We use a student management system called PowerSchool to keep you up-to-date on your student's progress in each class. To access student grades in PowerSchool, there are two options:

1) Go to <http://powerschool.cathedral-irish.org>. (Bookmark this page in your browser to have quick access in the future.) OR . . .

Go to our website [www.gocathedral.com](http://www.gocathedral.com) and click on "Quicklinks" in the upper right hand corner. Select PowerSchool.

2) From this screen, enter your login ID and password.

3) Once in PowerSchool, all grades and attendance will be seen from the front page window.

The teachers are updating this information every two weeks. If you have any questions or concerns about your student's progress, please contact the teacher. If you have difficulty accessing PowerSchool, please contact Rolly Landeros our chief information officer ([rlanderos@cathedral-irish.org](mailto:rlanderos@cathedral-irish.org)), and he'll make the necessary arrangements with you. PowerSchool grades do not go on your student's permanent record—this is merely a system to improve communication between school and home. It is our hope that by using PowerSchool most effectively, students can keep current on their progress and either feel supported in their hard work or know that they need to work harder. PowerSchool is not meant to replace the everyday conversations about "what happened in school today" that naturally occur between parent and child. At the end of my monthly Insight articles, I will list the upcoming dates for updating PowerSchool grades.

## Meet the Teacher Program

It is always helpful to "put a face with the name" of your student's teachers, so we host a program called

"Meet the Teacher." This year, the program will be held on Thurs., Aug. 26. It will begin at 7 p.m., and it will last approximately two hours. You will be given your student's class schedule, and you will spend nine minutes in each class (with a five-minute passing period). The teachers will be prepared to share course expectations with you. Since the time is so tight for this program, it is not the appropriate time to try to discuss your student's progress with the teacher, and the students do not need to be in attendance at this event.

## Homework for Absent Students

Sometimes during the school year, your student may miss class due to illness or other reasons. We encourage the students to get healthy before tackling school work, but sometimes they want to be sure they don't get too far behind. We ask that you check the Web site before contacting teachers to get assignments. All of our teachers are expected to keep daily assignments on their individual Web sites. Directions to get homework are as follows:

1. Go to the school Web site ([www.cathedral-irish.org](http://www.cathedral-irish.org)) and choose "For Parents." (It is at the very top of the page.)
2. From the "Academics" tab, click on the faculty/staff directory and choose the appropriate department.
3. Find the teacher's picture and click on his/her "Web site."
4. On the right side of the page, courses are listed for that teacher. Click on the correct course, and the homework should be listed in the classroom calendar.
5. If the teacher has no assignments listed, please e-mail that teacher. It may be that the teacher has not assigned homework.

## Campus Minister

As we begin this new school year we are excited to continue our exploration of a new (and renewed) partnership with the brothers of Holy Cross. We have spent time this summer in retreat discerning just what the charism of Holy Cross means to Cathedral. From a spirituality standpoint I am very excited about this possibility. We all know the former history of Cathedral and its affiliation with Holy Cross; they are a strong part of our beginnings. After many years apart we feel this new possibility is a positive step into a new future of cooperation and mutual benefit.

## Brightly Lit, Our Torch Inspires

Welcome to our Cathedral students, renewed and refreshed from a summer hiatus, ready to vigorously commence an exciting school year. A generously caring family wonderfully supports each of you, and we come together in our extended Cathedral community, to learn, love, and to do good works.

I invite each of you to take a moment and reflect upon a special individual who has ignited your love for service and compassion. We are called by God to serve our fellow mankind, so momentarily pause to think about the inspiration that you have individually experienced in life which invites and encourages your service.

It may be Hannah Teter, Olympian medalist and half-piper, who started Hannah's Gold, supporting a village in Africa.

Maybe it is your grandfather or grandmother, incredibly committed to St. Vincent De Paul or Family Services, who stirs you. Senior Taylor Walker-Anker has served at Family Services with her grandmother and warmly expresses the love and inspiration that she has received and rendered with a gentle and loving smile. Possibly your younger siblings or a peer, noteworthy for their valiant, unending compassion, have pressed themselves upon your noble heart.

I share with you my very special experience. Tío Frank, also known as Frank Megna, inspired fourteen of us in our first mission trip to the children's home in Peru three years ago. Some of you may remember him when he spoke to Cathedral students and community at our service festival during the fall three years ago. A vigorous gentleman of 78 years, Frank dedicated four months each year to the St. Francis Hogar in Chaclacayo, Peru.

There, Peruvian children, ages two to twenty year old, would greet him with an excited wave and hug, as he shared love, cheer, comfort, and support in his annual four-month visits. He communicated in a warm, enthusiastic language of part Italian, part Spanish, part English and the rest international love. His support

helped to renew the home's caretaker and founder, Dr. Tony Lazzara, and encouraged the healing of the children whose medical miracles Dr. Tony directs.

He has been a special friend to our family, and I ask each of you to join us in a gentle prayer of goodbye. Just a week ago, Frank Megna joined God during his trip to Virginia to aid a family member with the rigors of cancer treatment. He brought a love for God and mankind in his daily, cheery walk in life. We loved Tío Frank for the inspiration and vigor that he lit in our lives by knowing him and serving with him. We were unlikely acquaintances, residents in Indianapolis and Tampa, who met in Peru. We thank our God for the opportunity to know him and to have spoken with him just ten days ago, exchanging wonderful words of cheer and love.

In your next venture to Ben and Jerry's, order the Maple Blondie ice cream. It is dedicated to Hannah Teter's African village.

May we also tribute Tío Frank, Taylor's grandmother, and the torch that lights your path. It is a testimony to our God. We are his people and we affirm our love for our brothers and sisters through our noble works in Indianapolis and more.

So, as you light your torch, remember those who went before us in inspiration. Pick up the torch to guide yourself and illuminate the way for others to serve their brothers and sisters with love. Wrap yourself in the following scripture as you enjoy your starry eve or early morning's prayer:

## 2010-11 Service Hour Criteria

The annual service requirement is a minimum of 25 hours. The criteria are:

1. The service is to be performed for someone outside the student's family and neighborhood. It may be served for non-profit organizations or disadvantaged individuals. A list of non-profit organizations can be found on the web under On Campus/Service Outreach. HOT TIPS on new opportunities are posted each week on the Cathedral Web site under On Campus/Service Outreach/Current Service Opportunities (<http://www.cathedral-irish.org/page.cfm?p=980>).
2. The student should not receive any compensation for his/her service. It is not acceptable to work at one's employment or for a relative's company without receiving compensation and to submit it as service.
3. It is important to incorporate community service in the performed service. It is also not acceptable to have all twenty-five hours coming from on-campus Cathedral service and leadership.
4. Baby sitting and neighbor help will not be accepted as service.
5. Activities for which extra credit is given in a class will not count toward the service requirement. Activities taking place during class time when classes are missed are generally not valid for service.
6. As long as credit was not already received as a grade, service hours accumulated from a Service Learning Project for a specific class may count up to five hours of the required 25 hours. A grade is earned for the senior religion class Habitat for Humanity build and therefore cannot be accepted as service outreach hours. Service performed during class time cannot be credited as service hours.
7. The service must be documented on the 2010-11 Cathedral Service Documentation Form and turned into Mrs. Halstead in the Commons next to Fr. Munshower. The deadline for these forms is as follows:  
Freshman, Sophomores, Juniors by March 1, 2011.  
Seniors: All service hours are due by Dec 1, 2010.  
Late reporting of service hours will result in the withholding of the third quarter report for all students. Students should turn in their documentation forms as soon as their service has been completed. In order to be considered for service awards made at the end of each academic year at the end of April, service hours should be completed and submitted by April 4, 2011.
8. Service hours will be shown as completed or not completed on semester report cards. Additional visibility is provided in Parent School. In PowerSchool, there is a button in the upper right corner of the screen which reads Service Hours. Click on it and it will provide the service detail and summary by year.
9. A senior failing to complete their hours will not meet the requirements for graduation. For the class of 2011, a graduating senior should be achieving 100 service hours in total by completing their annual service requirement of twenty five hours during their four years of high school attendance at Cathedral. If a student transfers to Cathedral after their freshman year, this total is pro-rated. Because it is intended that our students engage in service hours each year during their four years, a student may not earn ahead their hours for each subsequent year. It is required that twenty five service hours be earned each year. All earned service hours are applauded and are recorded to show their total effort. A certificate listing these hours is available for college and scholarship application upon request.
10. Information supplied on the Cathedral Service Documentation Form will be reviewed for authenticity. Service must be validated by an agency representative when performed or by a parent.
11. If you prefer to develop a project basis for your service, see Service Project Basis under Service Outreach on the web for the details and guidelines.
12. The spirit of the service requirement speaks to the desired character of a Cathedral student. Failure to meet this requirement may put into question a student's enrollment at Cathedral for the following school year. CATHEDRAL HIGH SCHOOL  
TUITION ASSISTANCE POLICY (2010-11 SCHOOL YEAR)

Through the generosity of alumni, parents and friends of the school, Cathedral is able to offer tuition assistance (financial aid) to families with demonstrated financial need. There are no scholarships given for extracurricular activities of any kind (i.e., no athletic scholarships are given to any student.).

Tuition assistance funds are limited and therefore will not cover the total cost of a Cathedral High School education. Assistance is offered to families with demonstrated need who adhere to our published time frames and guidelines. Families applying for tuition assistance are strongly encouraged to follow all instructions and apply as soon as possible. Families wishing to be considered for tuition assistance must file the required forms or apply online on an annual basis. If families have more than one child enrolled at Cathedral, it is necessary to file only one form. If all children in the family are of school age, Cathedral encourages both parents to be employed outside the home unless there are extenuating circumstances. The Tuition Assistance Committee recommends that, whenever possible, Cathedral students age 16 and over share responsibility for their private education through summer employment and, to the extent possible, through part-time employment during the school year. There are a limited number of Work Study assignments available on campus. Final responsibility for tuition rests with parents, who, in the estimation of the committee, should to the extent they are able take steps necessary to assume financial obligation for their children's private education.

APPLYING FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR

- 1) Step One: Submit the Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) to School and Student Service for Financial Aid (SSS)—We are encouraging families to complete this form online ([www.sss.nais.org](http://www.sss.nais.org)) as soon as possible and no later than Feb. 28, 2010. DO NOT RETURN THIS FORM TO CATHEDRAL HIGH SCHOOL.

Cathedral High School's SSS code is 2172.

In the case of parents who are divorced or legally separated, the parent with primary physical custody of the student must file the PFS form regardless of financial agreement between parents.

- 2) Step Two: Submit Tax Documents—Submit a copy of all 2009 signed federal tax forms, together with W-2 statements and all schedules, for each parent listed on the Parents' Financial Statement (PFS) to the Enrollment Management Office at Cathedral High School as soon as possible but no later than April 15, 2010. DO NOT SEND TAX COPIES TO SSS. Cathedral High School reserves the right to request supporting documentation including divorce decrees and custodial agreements.

If you will be filing a tax extension request, you must provide Cathedral a copy of your extension form. As soon as your taxes are complete, submit a copy to Cathedral High School. Awards issued pending completion of tax returns will be subject to revision after submission of completed tax returns.

Tuition assistance decisions will be mailed to all families meeting the February 28 deadline by early May 2010. Late applications (those postmarked after Feb. 28, 2010) will be processed in the order in which they are received, although tuition assistance is not guaranteed under these circumstances. Award decisions for late applications may not be processed in time to be mailed by early May. Evaluation of tuition assistance requests will begin in a timely manner following Cathedral's receipt of the computer-generated Report of Financial Need (RFN) from SSS. The RFN form serves as a guideline to help determine need; however, Cathedral is not bound by the figure generated by the SSS. The distribution of tuition assistance resources adheres to the guidelines for tuition assistance adopted by the Cathedral Board of Directors.
