Dear Cathedral Parents,

It is with excitement that we welcome our freshman students to our Cathedral family. In addition, we have several transfer students to welcome, as well as our new parents. We are most pleased that you have chosen Cathedral to share in the educating of your children for the next four years. It is our goal to be sure that your child receives an education that provides to a diverse group of students opportunities for spiritual, intellectual, social, emotional and physical growth through service and academic excellence. It is an honor and a welcomed responsibility for us to help you shape your child through these very important years of development. We take our ministry most seriously and thank you for having confidence in Cathedral as your choice for the high school education of your child.

We have four new teachers joining us this summer to make our faculty complete. We welcome

□ Mrs. Dawn Gilmore, who will be teaching biology and chemistry this year. She holds Master's and Bachelor's Degrees from Indiana University and has taught as well as worked developing science programs during her professional career.

□ Mrs. Sarah Smith, who will be teaching chemistry. She holds a Bachelor's degree from St. Joseph College, a Master's from Purdue University, and her teaching certification from Indiana Wesleyan University. For the past few years, she has worked as a chemist at Lilly but has chosen to enter the teaching profession.

□ Mrs. Susan Mills, who will be teaching biology. She is a Cathedral parent and has a Bachelor's and Master's Degree from Butler University and has taught for many years.

□ Ms. Shawn Goodman, who will be our assistant band director and will work with our orchestra students. She has a Bachelor's of Music (Instrumental) from IUPUI, and has served as co-founder, president, and conductor of the Symphonic Youth Orchestra of Greater Indianapolis.

An advantage gained at the beginning of each school year is that every student begins with an "A average." As adults, we know that it is much easier to maintain a high average than to bring up a low one. Please encourage your students to begin the first quarter with strong academic grades and then work on maintaining this level all year.

One change for this year in our drug enforcement policy is that we will be utilizing a hair follicle test on students during our random drug screening. In the past, we have used a saliva (swab) test but are aware that a hair follicle test is more definitive and covers a longer period of time. Our goal is to help empower students to say "No!" when confronted with illegal substances and to help parents if a child tests positive for such drug abuse. Also, when a student tests positive, our first response is to notify parents and have a retest done privately to be sure that the first result was accurate. At that point, if it was accurate, we work with the family on the best way to bring help to this youngster.

On Sept. 13, Cathedral will celebrate her 91st birthday and will have some "birthday activities" involving your children. They stand on the shoulders of all of the alumni of Cathedral, St. Agnes, Ladywood, St. Mary's, and Our Lady of Grace who have preceded, them as well as Bishop Chartrand and the Brothers of Holy Cross. We thank God for these past years of providing quality education for the youth of Indianapolis and look forward to our next 90 years!

I wish each of you and your child(ren) a good remainder of the summer and welcome you to Cathedral High School for the 2009-10 school year. It is a great place to be!

# Campus Minister

## “Feeding the Spirit of Others”

For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.  
(Luke 19:10)

Each year at Cathedral we open with a theme. This year our theme is “Feeding the Spirit of Others.” We will use this theme as a foundation for all actions, planning, and activities. We will see it in the classrooms, in the halls, and carried out through every event we can. We ask you as parents to find ways to have family discussions centered on this theme.

How do we feed the Spirit of Others? It is in establishing a caring atmosphere. We must be genuine in our outreach to each student, to those who visit our campus, or those we encounter while we represent the school in the greater community.

We must look for opportunities to lift each other up. We must be positive, supportive, and encouraging. It is as simple as a senior looking out for the new freshman. It might be helping someone find a class or carrying one’s books.

It is the atmosphere of prayer that is imbued in our building. When someone shares a concern, we must assure that person we will take it to prayer. It is more

than the casual, “I will pray for you.” It is the real effort to make those prayers a priority. Some have even started a prayer journal that can include a small list of those we encounter who need prayer.

Most importantly, we have to care. That is harder than it sounds because we are so busy, so much in a hurry, so bombarded by the noise of the world. But to care takes time. It requires really, really, listening. It takes some questions back to the person sharing his concerns with you so he feels you are engaged in his story. It is more than being nosy or probing; it is trying to understand, to empathize, and to lovingly respond.

We are asking our students to model this behavior on campus. It is more difficult to keep it up on the weekends, at sporting events, when we are tired, or in conflict at home. That is where you come in as parents. You can model this attitude as well.

You can be the caring parent. We are not asking you to act like something you are not. We are asking you to try to make little changes that show this caring attitude. We want you to be able to feed the Spirit of your family and then others. All good actions are caught, more than taught. We know you are being watched as a model whether your child lets you know that or not.

## **PowerSchool**

We use a student management system called *PowerSchool* to keep you up-to-date on your student's progress in each class. To access student's grades in *PowerSchool*, there are two options:

- 1) Go to <http://powerschool.cathedral-irish.org>. (Bookmark this page in your browser to have quick access in the future.) OR . . . Go to our Website <http://www.catehdral-irish.org> and click on "Quicklinks" in the upper right hand corner. Select *PowerSchool*.
- 2) Parent login IDs will be issued on Wed., Aug. 5, 2009. From this screen, enter your login ID and password.
- 3) Once in *PowerSchool*, all grades and attendance will be seen from the front page window.

The teachers are updating this information every two weeks. If you have any questions or concerns about your student's progress, please contact the teacher. If you have difficulty accessing *PowerSchool*, please contact our chief information officer, Rolly Landeros ([rlanderos@cathedral-irish.org](mailto:rlanderos@cathedral-irish.org)), and he'll make the necessary arrangements with you. *PowerSchool* grades do not go on your student's permanent record—this is merely a system to improve communication between school and home. It is our hope that by using *PowerSchool* most effectively, students can keep current on their progress and either feel supported in their hard work or know that they need to work harder. *PowerSchool* is not meant to replace the everyday conversations about "what happened in school today" that naturally occur between parent and child. At the end of my monthly *Insight* articles, I will list the upcoming dates for updating *PowerSchool* grades.

## **Meet the Teacher Program**

It is always helpful to "put a face with the name" of your student's teachers, so we host a program called "*Meet the Teacher*." This year, the program will be held on Thurs., Aug. 27. It will begin at 7 p.m., and it will last approximately two hours. You will be given

your student's class schedule, and you will spend nine minutes in each class (with a five-minute passing period). The teachers will be prepared to share course expectations with you. *Since the time is so tight for this program, it is not the appropriate time to try to discuss your student's progress with the teacher, and the students do not need to be in attendance at this event.*

## **Homework for Absent Students**

Sometimes during the school year, your student may miss class due to illness or other reasons. We encourage the students to get healthy before tackling school work, but sometimes they want to be sure they don't get too far behind. We ask that you check the Website before contacting teachers to get assignments. All of our teachers are expected to keep daily assignments on their individual Websites. Directions to get homework are as follows:

1. Go to the school Website ([www.cathedral-irish.org](http://www.cathedral-irish.org)) and choose "For Parents." (It is at the very top of the page.)
2. From the "Academics" tab, click on the faculty/staff directory and choose the appropriate department.
3. Find the teacher's picture and click on his/her "Website."
4. On the right side of the page, courses are listed for that teacher. Click on the correct course, and the homework should be listed in the classroom calendar.
5. If the teacher has no assignments listed, please e-mail that teacher. It may be that the teacher has not assigned homework.

## Orientations

All students are expected to attend the orientation time assigned to them.

**Freshmen** should be at school on Aug. 10 from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Lunch will be provided for them. Their I.D. photo will be taken, so students may dress in modest attire for the day. Please no jeans, shorts, or sweats.

For the upperclassmen the times are as follows:

**Seniors** should report at 8:30 a.m. and will be dismissed by 10 a.m.

**Juniors** should report by 10 a.m. to be dismissed by 12:30 p.m.

**Sophomores**, please report by 12:30 p.m. to be dismissed by 2 p.m.

All groups should report to the Auditorium dressed in modest and appropriate school attire. I.D. Photos will be taken for seniors.

All students received a photo package to purchase a picture with their schedules. If you wish a picture, please return with the appropriate payment.

At orientation Bluebooks will be given. Each student and each family will receive one copy. The family copy will be given to all freshmen or the youngest in the family if there is no freshman student.

## Welcome Dance

## Driving, Parking, and Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

We are asking that all families please abide by the following regulations and safety concerns while operating a motor vehicle on Cathedral high school grounds.

- The speed limit for the campus is 20 mph.
- There is no dropping off or picking up students on the circle.
- Traffic on the circle has the right of way.
- All posted traffic signs are to be observed.
- When dropping students off in the morning parents should enter the lot by the electronic sign and should not proceed to the circle unless you intend to drop your student off at the Student Life Center or Cunningham Fine Art Center.
- Parents entering the lot by the electronic sign should drop off their students using the lane in front of the Welch Activity Center. Do not turn left into the lot and enter through the parking lanes.
- Students and faculty using the lot in front of the Welch Activity Center should enter from the circle and enter the lot by making a right turn into the lot and proceeding to your proper parking place.
- Parents dropping off early avoid traffic and help prevent congestion.
- Parents picking up students are advised to wait until 3:20 p.m. By doing this you allow the student drivers to vacate the campus and which relieves after school congestion.
- Please there is no parking or stopping on the hill at any time. This would include after school activities also.
- Please do not cut through the parking lots.

# Service Outreach

## 2009-10 Service Hour Criteria

The annual service requirement consists of a minimum of 25 hours. The criteria are:

1. **The service is to be performed for someone outside the student's family and neighborhood. It may be served for non-profit organizations or disadvantaged individuals.** A list of non-profit organizations can be found in the Blue Book or on the Web under On Campus/Service Enrichment. **HOT TIPS** on new opportunities are posted each week on the Cathedral Website under On Campus/Service Enrichment/Current Service Opportunities (<http://www.cathedral-irish.org/page.cfm?p=980>).
  2. The student should not receive any compensation for his/her service. It is not acceptable service to work at one's employment for free or for a relative's company.
  3. It is important to incorporate community service in the performed service. It is also not acceptable to have all twenty-five hours coming from on-campus Cathedral service and leadership.
  4. Babysitting and neighbor help will not be accepted as service performance.
  5. Activities for which extra credit is given in a class will not count toward the service requirement. Activities taking place during class time when classes are missed are generally not valid for service.
  6. **As long as credit was not already received as a grade**, service hours accumulated from a Service Learning Project for a specific class may count up to 5 hours of the required 25 hours. A grade is earned for the senior religion class Habitat for Humanity build and, therefore, **cannot be accepted as service enrichment hours. Service performed during class time cannot be credited as service.**
  7. The service must be documented on the 2009-10 Cathedral Service Documentation Form and turned into Mrs. Halstead in the Commons next to Fr. Munshower. The deadline for these forms is as follows:  
Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors: April 23, 2010.  
Seniors: Community service hours are due by Nov. 1, 2009.  
Leadership hours are due by March 1, 2010.
- Late reporting of service hours will result in the withholding of the third quarter report for seniors and of the second semester report card for the underclassmen. Students should turn in their documentation forms as soon as their service has been completed. **In order to be considered for service awards made at the end of each academic year at the end of April, service hours should be completed and submitted by April 6, 2010.**
8. Service hours will be shown as completed or not completed on semester report cards. Additional visibility is provided in Parent Connect as a % of completion. Click on the total to see the number of hours out of 25 which have been recorded as completed.
  9. A senior failing to complete their hours will not meet the requirements for graduation.  
For the class of 2010, a graduating senior should be achieving 100 service hours in total by completing their annual service requirement during their four years of high school attendance at Cathedral. If a student transfers to Cathedral after their freshman year, this total is pro-rated. Because it is intended that our students engage in service hours each year during their four years, a student may not earn ahead their hours for each subsequent year. All service hours earned are commended and are recorded to capture their total effort. A certificate listing these hours is available for college and scholarship application upon request.
  10. Information supplied on the Cathedral Service Documentation Form will be reviewed for authenticity. Service must be validated on the form when it is performed by an agency representative or by a parent.
  11. **The spirit of the service requirement speaks to the desired character of a Cathedral student. Failure to meet this requirement may put into question a student's enrollment at Cathedral for the following school year.**

Even though fall season is knocking on the door and all of our teams are in full force for a great year in 2009-10, I do need to look back and recognize accomplishments from the 2008-09 season and tournaments. First, I would like to congratulate all of the athletes, coaches, and fans. The 2008-09 school year may have been the most successful in Cathedral history. I am sure the class of 2009 will debate this for years to come. The hard work and dedication of the Cathedral athletes earned four team state championships and the fourteenth IHSA mental attitude award winner. In the fall, Jean Kesterson and the girls' volleyball team started the year capturing its sixth state title.
