The Learning Resource Center will expand the services offered to students already admitted to the school's renowned Language Support Program, but also offer services to students not enrolled in the Language Support Program, but who have diagnosed needs for accommodations. While there will continue to be an annual fee for the direct instruction offered by the Language Support Program, all of the benefits of the Learning Resource Center will be available to students and families at no additional cost.
