Megaphone staff members earn honors at state convention

INDIANAPOLIS—October 21—Three members of the Megaphone newspaper staff earned recognition at the annual convention of the Indiana High School Press Association for work published during the 2013-2014 school year.

The honors are the equivalent of individual state championships in the various contest categories. Called the Harvey Awards, which are named for long-time Fort Wayne South Side High School journalism teacher Rowena Harvey, recognition was presented at the Oct. 17 closing ceremonies of the convention at Franklin College and were confirmed today by Diana Hadley, executive director of the state high school press association.

Cathedral award winners, which competes in Division II for schools with enrollments between 1,001 and 2,000:

- Ian Kea '14, third place in news writing;
- Ben Sasin '14, third place in feature photography;
- Junior Emerson Wolff, second place in sports writing and fourth place in feature writing.

Because the contest is based on material published during the previous school year, members of the Class of 2014 were eligible to have their work entered.

Tony Willis, journalism teacher and Megaphone faculty moderator, said, "These students can be extremely proud of their work. To be recognized among the state's best high school journalists is quite an achievement."
